



## Transportation at a Glance in New York State

New York State has 113,669 miles of highways:

- 15,034 miles are state highways.
- State-owned highways include 1,522 miles owned by state authorities.
- 574 miles of state authority-owned highways are tolled.
- 97,113 miles are local roads.

New York State owns 14.5 % of the highways that carry 51.9% of the traffic:

- NYSDOT owns 13.2% of the state's highways; they carry 44.2% of the traffic.
- State authorities own 1.3% of the highways that carry 7.7% of the traffic.
- Local governments own 85.4% of the highways that carry 48.1% of the traffic.

New York State has 17,406 highway bridges:

- NYSDOT owns 7,632 highway bridges, 43.8% of the total.
- State authorities own 1,187 highway bridges, 6.8% of the total.
- Local governments own 8,587 highway bridges, 49.3% of the total.

About 130 transit operators provide transit service to New York State riders:

- The Metropolitan Transportation Authority provides subway, bus and commuter service in the New York Metropolitan Region.
- Four state transit authorities provide transit service in the Albany, Syracuse, Rochester and Buffalo metropolitan regions.
- Transit operators other than the MTA operate about 4,568 buses in urban areas.
- Transit operators other than MTA operate about 713 buses in rural and mixed areas.

Amtrak operates rail passenger service on 713 miles of rail routes in New York State:

- Amtrak operates New York's Empire Service from New York City to Niagara Falls - 460 miles.
- Amtrak operates 13 round trips per day from New York City to Albany.
- Amtrak operates four round trips per day from Albany west.
- Service west of Albany includes the Lake Shore Ltd to Chicago, Ill.
- Amtrak operates one round trip per day from Albany to Montreal, Canada.
- Amtrak operates one round trip per day from Albany to Rutland, Vt.



Thirty-six freight railroads provide rail freight service in New York State:

- Two U.S. and two Canadian Class I railroads operate on 2,000 route miles in New York State.
- Four regional railroads operate on 302 route miles.
- Twenty-one local railroads operate on 1,103 route miles.
- Seven switching railroads operate on 129 route miles.

New York State has 490 public airports:

- New York State receives air service at 18 commercial service airports.
- In 2007, 45 million air travelers were enplaned at all New York State airports.
- In 2006, New York State airports handled 6.7 billion pounds freight.

Five ports provide marine service to New York State:

- The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey operates Red Hook Terminal and New York Marine Terminal.
- State ports serve Albany, Buffalo, Ogdensburg and Oswego.
