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
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The University Transportation Research Center Publishes the Final Report for the Research Project Titled: "Corrosion Damage Assessment of Post-Tensioned Concrete Structures"

UTRC has released a final report for the research titled: "Corrosion Damage Assessment of Post-Tensioned Concrete Structures", funded by the Research and Innovative Technology Administration/USDOT (RITA). The principal investigator was *Dr. Salvatore Salamone*, an assistant professor of Civil, Structural and Environmental Engineering at the University at Buffalo (SUNY).

Detecting corrosion in the tendons of post-tensioned (PT) concrete structures is technically challenging. The general inaccessibility of the tendons makes evaluation difficult, costly and often inconclusive. This study had two objectives. The first objective was to design, implement and validate the use of an innovative monitoring system based on embedded arrays of low profile piezoelectric transducers to generate and receive guided ultrasonic waves (GUW) over the length of a prestressing tendon. The second objective was to develop a new signal processing technique based on fractal theory, to enable the monitoring of the corrosion progression. To accomplish the objectives of the study, accelerated corrosion tests were carried out on two seven wire steel strands embedded in two concrete blocks.
