## UTRC AWARDED \$25 MILLION FROM U.S. DOT, NY STATE

The University Transportation Research Center (UTRC) Region 2, based at The City College of New York, has received more than \$25 million in new federal and state funding. It received \$5.2 million for 2013 and 2014 from the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) through the Research and Innovative Technology Administra-University (RITA's) tion's Transportation Center (UTC) program – plus \$10 million over five years from the New York State Department of Transportation (DOT) and another \$10 million over five years from the New York Metropolitan Transportation Council (MTC).

"The award from the federal government is a tremendous vote of confidence not only for us but also for the region we serve, said Dr. Camille Kamga, the center's director. "UTRC will promote research that supports the USDOT strategic goals to improve public health and safety, foster livable communities, ensure that transportation assets are maintained in a state of good repair, support the nation's long-term economic competiveness, and work to achieve environmental sustainability.'
